


Sea Sponges

Their larvae are carried by the ocean waves, and that's how they disperse.




Sponges come in different sizes and are made of different cells.

Each cell has a special function, or a job it must perform.




Sponges, called porifera (paw-rif-er-uh), have many openings called pores. Flowing water brings the food into these tiny open doors.

yellow boring sponge







Sponges live almost everywhere out in the bring sea.


A few live in freshwater in the lakes near you and me.
