Where in the World is North America?






North America is a continent. It is the third largest in size.

Over five hundred million people live on this continent today.




North America has around nine and a half million square miles of land.

Twenty-four countries and territories make up this continent.


French, English, and Spanish are the languages spoken here to a great extent.

There is the Rocky Mountain region where you will see lots of snow.




The Coastal Ranges go up and down the entire Pacific coast.

The Coastal Plain runs down the eastern seaboard to the Panama Canal.


The Basin and Range starts in Alaska and passes through the Pacific coast locale.
