Students can apply to the Career and College Promise Program as rising juniors. The CCP program allows qualified high school juniors and seniors in North Carolina the opportunity to pursue college courses (tuition free) while in high school. The CCP program accelerates completion of college certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees that lead to college transfer or provide entry-level job skills. CCP is designed for students who are college-ready while in high school and who want to get a head start on college. Students must have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 or higher to be eligible. River Mill Academy currently offers a pair of American History classes (HIS131/HIS132), two pairs of Criminal Justice classes (CJC 111/121 and CJC 141/212), a psychology and public speaking combination class (PSY150/COM231), and a music appreciation class (MUS110) on our campus. Students can take additional ACC classes online, on campus after school hours, or during the summer.
